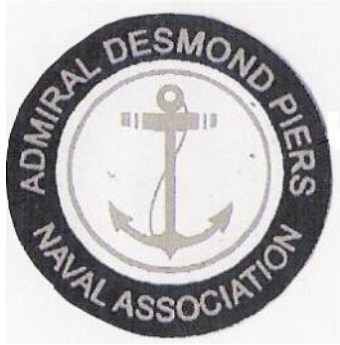

Yarmouth: - Operation Wounded Soldiers is underway and students who belong to the Maple Grove Memorial Club are preparing to send care packages that will likely weigh more than four kilograms apiece. The club is also sending thousands of laminated guardian angel posters to troops in Afghanistan. Maple Grove Education Centre is a junior high school near Yarmouth. The school's Memorial Club plans events for Veterans and serving members of Canada's Armed Forces. A branch of the club also operates at Yarmouth's senior high school. Master Cpl. Jeff Rainey, wounded near Kandahar, is now back in Canada and he said "the Maple Grove Memorial Club is an absolutely unique club. About 3,000 guardian angels have been made up and laminated so they will last and are sending one to everybody. The guys hang them in their bed space or possibly stick one up on the inside of their vehicle....."

Teacher Joe Bishara, the Memorial Club leader, said "M/Cpl Rainey will distribute the care packages throughout his unit, 1st Battalion Royal Canadian Regiment at Canadian Forces Base Petawawa in Ontario....."
